### **Dorot Fellowship in Israel | \$21,000**

Just about the greatest thing since sliced bread, if you get this fellowship, you're sitting pretty for a year. To be eligible, you need to be an American or a Canadian between the ages of 22 and 35. You CANNOT be working or plan to work in a Jewish field.

### **Boren Scholarship | Up to \$20,000**

Boren Scholarships provide funds to U.S. undergraduate students to study abroad in areas of the world that are critical to U.S. interests and underrepresented in study abroad who will contribute to U.S. national security, broadly defined.

### **Masa Israel Journey | \$500 - \$7,500**

For Jewish young adults 18 – 30 years old, studying or volunteering in Israel for at least 5 consecutive months on an approved Masa program

### **Abe and Gert Nutkis Scholarship | Up to \$5,000**

The Abe and Gert Nutkis (AGN) Scholarship for Israel Study and Service enables young adults 18-30 to study in Israel and foster personal involvement with Israel society and Zionist ideals. Scholarship recipients are eligible to receive grants for full-year study in a co-educational institution of higher learning in Israel. Recipients must concurrently perform a minimum of four hours weekly volunteer service throughout the academic year with ATZUM or an ATZUM approved organization.

This competitive grant, awarded to undergraduates from any Brandeis department pursuing academic or career interests in Israel. This wide-reaching grant covers academic pursuits in science and business, as well as social sciences, humanities and arts. It was created to provide impetus for undergraduates to travel to Israel to learn Hebrew, intern in social justice projects, NGOs, Israeli companies and laboratories, participate in research projects from archaeology to contemporary issues, engage in professional training, or join academic programs such as Brandeis study abroad.
